Dear Brother Wurmbrand

Thank so much for your both of your letters dated on the 29th & 31st of January. Immediately after receiving of your letters, I found the P.O. Box 26 belongs to the Bank of Korea and I asked the deliverer at the bank whether I could find out where the letters and checks were. However it was a knotty point to find out because they didn't have any record for back letter except for registered mail. I have received the \$780 check for the previous three month of broadcasting.

The enclosed brochure is our Gospel message sent out through the Far East Broadcasting station(Call sign is HLKX) located in Seoul operated by TEAM Mission. The address is as follow:

On the matter about the balloon evangelism, I has been in contact with Army psychological warfare staff, National Meteorologist and Air Force weather staff officer. Finally I found that there are several difficulties, first the Meteorological balloons have to be supported by Air Force because we couldn't get any meteorological balloons have purchased in the town market. In case we get it from the Air Force we not only have to pay \$50 per 100g balloon but also quantity is limited. If imported from Japan it will cost \$60 per 100g of balloons. The other problem is transportation because the balloon might be released in the front line areas where certain places usually used for this work by an authority. If we have a four wheel drive vehicle it is very convenient to climb high ground carrying the hydrogen container and other materials. The Gospels will be ordered in a specially designed print they will be carry by light balloons. It may cost 10Won each and 10Won per 10 tracts for this purpose. On a bottle of hydrogen the cost is 1500Won. It is enough to fill 200 balloons.

Dear Mr. Wurmbrand,

I am a friend of Col. Park and would like to explain some of the difficulties he's having in conducting balloon evangelism. First he's without a vehicle of any kind that makes his everyday work difficult. The terrain of Korea is the second problem. It is so mountainous here and he has found no co-operation from many sources including army facilities to obtain a vehicle needed to climb these rocky mountains, where the balloons would have to be released at night. Plus he's unable to obtain these balloons in Korea in any quantity which is also necessary. Col. Park is one of the most conscientious Christians I have met here among the nationals. He is very willing to help you in this program but wants you to know that these difficulties are present. Without a vehicle, balloons etc. he feels this program is almost impossible in the near future.



Do you have any suggestions for me? I will be glad to help in anyway possible. I'm looking forward to reading your "gathered book," "Tortured for Christ,"

this week.
